<u>Trepak from the Nutcraker</u> (arr. K. Cook): This is a fun solo to throw in the holiday mix, especially after one too many Silent Nights. It's sure to delight and surprise listeners!

<u>Silver Bells</u> (arr. L. Alpino): I love the middle section of this piece-it's an "oooooohhhh! so pretty!" moment that everyone loves.

<u>Season's Greetings</u> (arr. S. Thormahlen): I frequently use this book in both my teaching and when putting together a quick holiday program. This collection features some pop selections not often arranged for harp. Frosty the Snowman is a particular favorite of mine-I always picture my dad singing along to it from when we were kids!

<u>A Charlie Brown Christmas</u> (S. Woods): <u>Christmas Time is Here</u> — A classic that brings everyone back to their childhood - a true crowd favorite!

<u>Christmas Collection</u> (Y. Kondonassis): I LOVE this collection. She takes full advantage of the harp's capabilities and her arrangements are beautiful and unique. Check out her CD Dream Season.

<u>Christmas Music for the Harp, Vol. 2</u> (McDonald & Wood): I can't remember the last time a Christmas has gone by without performing both Silent Night and Coventry Carol from this collection. A wonderful option for your Christmas eve gigs. The last variation of Silent Night incorporates RH glissandos and is always a congregation pleaser!

<u>We Three Kings</u> - arr. Frank Voltz: Frank's arrangements are among my favorites. The rhythms add a new and fun feel to this traditional carol. . The notes are printed large making it a real easy read!!

O Holy Night McDonald/Wood: I have such great memories of hearing large choirs sing this piece with an amazing soloist. This arrangement allows you to match that sound. As always with McDonald/ Wood the fingering falls right into your hands and the result is a really beautiful addition to your holiday choices!

<u>I Wonder as I Wander</u> - Cindy Hortsman: Cindy's arrangements have a unique style that and makes you feel ready to join a jazz trio immediately!! I have always loved the hauntingly beauty of this piece. I like to play it in its original form first, then go into Cindy's version.

MJ (Hangin' with the Harp Host)

<u>A Christmas Medley</u> (arr. J Jennings): A wonderful piece for beginner/intermediate students, this medley weaves three Christmas favorites (Good King Wenceslas, Silent Night and Away in the Manger) together, but each piece can also be played as a solo.

<u>Christmas Eve</u> (arr. S. Staneslaw) <u>In the Bleak Midwinter</u>: In this well-crafted arrangement, Sunita captures the true spirit of a stark December landscape.

<u>12 Days of Harpiness</u> (A. Sullivan): If you're looking to spice up your holiday repertoire, this piece is for you. A humorous take on the traditional carol, there's a challenging pedal harp part with plenty of foot work as well as a simpler, but just as fun lever version.
